Each ninth grade student is assigned to a team of teachers when entering Franklin High School. That team is composed of a

Language Arts teacher, a World History teacher and a Physical Science teacher. Those three teachers share the same group of students and those students travel together as a class between those three subjects. We feel that this structure makes a student's entry into Franklin more personal by giving students a common group of peers and a common group of teachers. These teachers work together throughout the year to create the best learning experience possible for each student. Each of the ninth grade teams complete common projects, like the 9th grade poetry slam and history day.

9th grade students are expected to take responsibility for their own learning and each prepare for a student-led performance conference with families.

Tenth Grade at Franklin

- Students choose which of four academic communities to join:
 - —Academy of Finance
 - —CREATE (focus on Engineering & Architecture)
 - —Humanities
 - —Public Service Academy
- Our academies are composed of Language
 Arts and Social Studies teachers and some elective teachers who continue the personal approach to each student's education.
- All academies provide continued skill assessment and instruction to prepare for the WASL exam.

Eleventh Grade and Beyond

Students stay with their community and begin more academy-focused classes.

Twelfth Grade

Senior projects designed to showcase the skills students' have attained throughout their tenure at FHS are a graduation requirement. The focus and approach to these projects center on student choice. Presentations and an accompanying research paper are required, along with the attainment of certain standards of excellence.

Franklin High School students are prepared for success after high school. Students work closely with their counselor and programs like College Access Now to apply to and prepare for university. All upperclassmen are provided with the opportunity to apply for internships, job-shadows, or mentorships with local professionals and community organizers.
